## A NOTE FROM JENNIFER

Your membership has a direct and noticeable impact on this community.

Through your membership, WECU donated over **\$400,000** to numerous nonprofits and community groups in 2019.

### Education First

In September, we launched the Education First Grant program. This program focuses on financial and community education and is true to our history of being a credit union founded by Bellingham Teachers. Four nonprofits received a total of \$110,000 as a part of this program.

### Penny Campaign

In October and November, every time a WECU member swiped their debit card, one penny was earned by the member and WECU matched it with a donation to our community. In October, those pennies totaled \$14,325.94. The money was donated to local organizations supporting veterans in our community. In November, four local nonprofits that support affordable housing and combating homelessness, were awarded with funds from this campaign.

### Community Builder Grants

Through our Branch Sponsorships and Community Builder Grants, WECU supports numerous local programs. In 2019, we made over 110 donations totaling over \$42,000.

### We Give Our Time

Our employees are always eager to pitch in when there is a need. Team WECU, comprised of employees who graciously donate their free time to support non-profits, was involved in 24 community events in 2019.

### Lydia Place House

As a part of our giving, we also provide and maintain a house to Lydia Place that is used by families in need. Over the last two years, 11 families have been able to stay together and use the house in their time of need. WECU was recently recognized for this gift with a Lydia Place Housing Hero Award. None of this would be possible without your membership.

Thank you for your membership and for believing in the credit union movement - one that puts people over profit. Together, we will ensure WECU and the communities we serve are strong, successful and making a meaningful difference for many years to come.

## Housing Hero

WECU has been recognized as a Housing Hero by Lydia Place, a nonprofit whose mission is to disrupt the cycle of homelessness and promote sustained independence for current and future generations. In an awards banquet which took place on Dec 3, WECU was recognized for its charitable donation of a residential property, the "Chestnut House," which has provided a home to 11 families since 2015. This gift is estimated at \$21,000 per year.

## Financial Education

WECU believes in the importance of financial education and in the impact it can have in our members' lives. So far this year, WECU staff have taught 108 financial education lessons. That's a yearly average of more than two classes every single week! Stay tuned for the official Community Impact Report in early January for the final number.
